

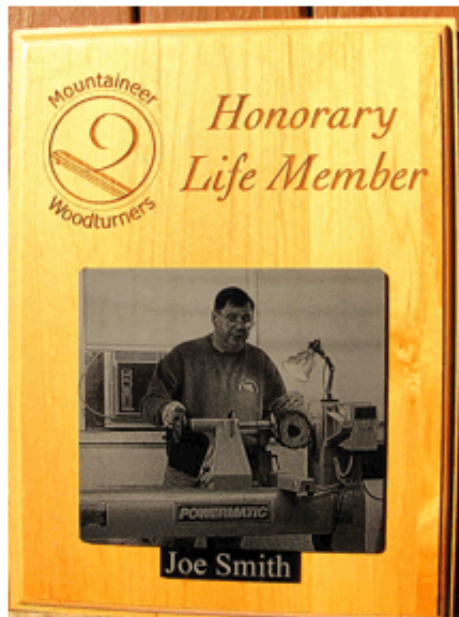

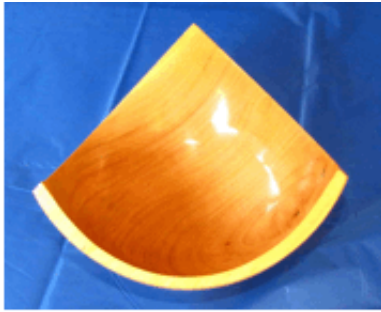

Show and Tell



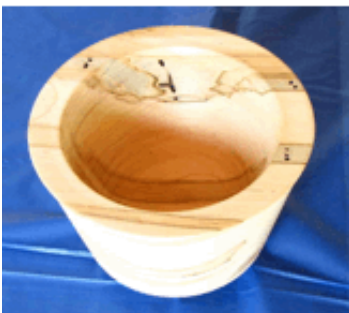
Fred Belknap turned a walnut bowl and a three cornered bowl from cherry.

John Stigall showed his ambrosia maple bowl, still in progress.

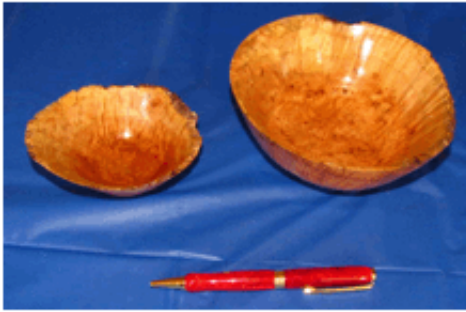


Kirk Rector brought two bowls, one from osage orange and the other was unknown. He also included a duck call.
